Morning guys, here is this fortnights report, its a little shorter as with the waters still coming it was hard to know what will be true by thursday lol.

Well what a fortnight it's been. Wind, rain, cool days and hot days. Mother Nature is all over the place. Lucky for us the fish don't seem to mind and where there's a will there's a way. Lets check out the report.

Now that region has seen even more rain the creeks and inlets should be jam packed full of bait. Cast netting has been producing plenty of mullet and herring. Prawns are still top of the list with most getting their bag limit. They do move around but when you find a school, they are great quality. Another bait bonus to the cooler months is squid locals have been hand spearing or jigging a few up around the shallows and coffee rock ledges.

Drifting through the deeper waters has got most their bag limits on winter whiting, still only an average size of 21 -23cm but enough for a fresh feed, and with squid, sand crabs and some prawns showing up it doesn't take much to get your every own sea food banquet.

Mud crabs are still running with some stonkers being caught. Definitely worth soaking a pot.

Add into the mix the pelagic fish such as Tuna, Queenies and Maceral being reported in multiple locations such as around the channels between snout point and the bluff. River Heads to Urangan and off the pier fisho's are sure to have the arms stretched.

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We have had some very wild and wet weather. A late shout out to the PCPA Expo Team for a successful event and a kind donation. A big thank you to the volunteer team who manned our Fire Brigade Display at Easter and the other brigades who helped at this great event. Thank you to the volunteers who helped with the Anzac Day commemorations.

Our team completed First aid training and CPR training in May. 12 members now have their proficiency in both areas. Training has become highly intensive and costly, due to each brigade having to pay for one of their own volunteer members to become a trainer. This was not the case previously, as the Maryborough Office used to provide us with a paid staff member to train us. Once again, our own time, and our expenses are rising, and we are all unpaid volunteers. There are 36,000 unpaid volunteer fire fighters in Qld. Doing a great job.

Our next General Meeting will be held on the 11th of June at 2pm. There will be training and a bbq. All welcome to attend the meeting and the bbq.

Kahu and I attended the last PCPA meeting to explain and clarify the work being done on the Fire Tracks around Poona. The rocks on the corner of Cockatoo Cres., were trucked in for the Fire Breaks and are owned by the FCRC. Work has been halted by the rain. Kahu has been working on these Fire Breaks with all agencies for many years. We need Fire Breaks around all areas of Poona for your safety. Currently, they are incomplete. The purpose of a Fire Break is for access by the fire appliances and maintenance is important. You can do your bit by mowing and keeping the area tidy, taking rubbish and tree limbs to the transfer station, and keeping your fence line clear. Safety is a Community Effort.

Thank you to the Poona Community for their continued support and encouragement. New members are always welcome.

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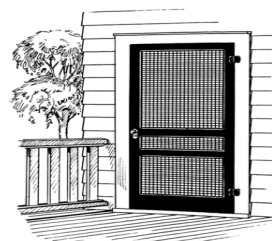
